The East Door #1 will be unlocked for participants to enter 30 minutes prior to and 30 minutes after the start of any church sponsored events. Generations in Faith Together (GiFT) begins this month as well. This is our new version of what we used to call Sunday School which was only for children. GiFT is faith formation conversation, fellowship, sharing, caring, praying, and blessing for ALL AGES in our congregation. I invite you to wholeheartedly engage in this new "holy experiment." It will be different. It will be scary, perhaps. It will shatter the old idiom "the way we've always done it." And that's all ok.

There will be a guide on each table to help get you going each week with the Faith5 (Share -Read - Talk - Pray - Bless), as well as a bookmark you can take home and put in your Bible or devotional book that encourages you to do the Faith5 in your home as well.

On October 6th we will welcome New Members into our family of faith here at Bethesda!

Introduction to "Life-enriching Communication" Offered

"Life-enriching Communication" is a way of connecting with your self and others with true empathy, effectiveness and satisfaction. Come to a 1.5 hour introduction to find out more and consider being part of a group that will learn and practice "Life-enriching Communication."

Introductory sessions (1.5 hours) will be offered on Tuesday, September 24, 7:00–8:30 pm; OR, Wednesday, September 25, 7:00 - 8:30 pm. Both options will be at Bethesda Lutheran Church in the Fellowship Room. This session is FREE.

A bi-weekly gathering will begin Tuesday, October 8. There is no cost for these sessions, except for the purchase of a book. The Introductory session is not required to participate - you may already know something about Nonviolent Communication; or you find you are just ready to dive in. "Life-enriching Communication" is based on insights and ideas of "Nonviolent Communication,"

which was developed by Marshall Rosenberg. All sessions will be facilitated by Joel Westby (he, him, his). Joel has 14 years of experience with Nonviolent Communication and has facilitated workshops in both a faith context and public context. Joel is a retired ELCA pastor who spent the last 13 years of his career as an Intentional Interim Pastor. Joel will be available after worship at Bethesda on Sunday, September 8 & amp; 22, if you'd like to meet him and get a response to questions you may have.

The Introductory session and the bi-weekly sessions are open to people of Bethesda, other churches and the community at-large. You are welcome to invite a friend or group of people.

Building on Faith Update August 2024

Thank you to the entire congregation for supporting our Building on Faith Capital Campaign and making the roofing project happen. It's been a very busy summer, and you can see the updates happening at the church.

Construction Activities

Northland Glass completed the replacement of the upper clearstory windows above the chancel in mid-July. Fargo Roofing and Siding began work on the shingling on August 1, and it was a loud and exciting few days as they completed the majority of the shingle replacement. Workers were onsite from early morning until late evening. Most of the shingling has been completed, and the finishing work will be completed after the siding project. A few days later Lemke Home Improvements joined the action and the siding installation began. This is the most visible part of the project and is 80% complete as of August 19, 2024. The rubber roof membrane replacement will be the last part of the project, once siding and shingling are complete. John Larson has been our project point person and has been working with YHR Architects and the contractors to assure quality work and to address any issues that arise during the construction project. Although we did have a roof leaking problem when there was heavy rain during some of the construction, we have not run into any major construction oversites or change orders yet. Thank you, John!

We are so blessed with a congregation that fully supports the Building on Faith capital campaign and continues to step up with financial support. 2024 Building on Faith contributions are \$115,000 through July. We have \$278,000 of cash ready to pay to the contractors; we've tithed \$15,000 to Table of Mercy and MSUM Crossroads Lutheran Campus Ministry; and we'll receive the balance of our insurance claim once construction is complete. After all the roofing construction is complete and paid for the next construction projects will be reviewed by our Property Committee.


